



In-School Visit Programme Frequently Asked Questions

Why are we doing this?

It is well recognised that a strong relationship between families and school provides the best possible support for every child. The Education Endowment Foundation is the UK's leading education research organisation. Their most recent report on parent engagement suggests that effective parent engagement can lead to learning gains of 3 months over the course of a year. This makes effective parent engagement a key element of successfully supporting every child to thrive, our vision for every child in a Maritime school.

These visits aim to create a strong relationship between home and school by:

- Allowing parents/ carers time to get to know their child's new teacher - this time will allow families to explore who the new teacher is, what they expect in class, how concerns and praise will be fed back to parents and so on.
- Giving children the opportunity to get to know their new teacher and explore their new learning environment - something that can make a big difference to the confidence of children starting a new academic year.
- Providing each teacher time to get to know each child joining their class - for example what they love to do both at school and at home. This allows each teacher to tailor and personalise their lessons to reflect the children's interests and needs.
- Allowing each teacher to get to know each child's family so there is a strong relationship between school and home, ready to support each child as needed.

We piloted additional in school visits in several of our Maritime schools in September 2023. We received lots of positive feedback from teachers, parents and children.
