Topic Theme- Marvellous Me

This half term, our topic is 'Marvellous Me'. We are learning about; ourselves, our families, our homes, the toys we like and our local area.

Marvellous Me Core Books

We will be reading these fiction and nonfiction books to support our 'Marvellous Me' topic lessons and learning.



Prime Areas of Learning

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Our focus this half term is your child's transition into Nursery. To do so we will;

- Support your child to develop bonds with staff, peers and their key person
- Get them familiar with their session routines
- Develop their confidence and use of language when communicating with

Communication and Language (CL)

We will learn keywords, vocabulary and Makaton signs of family members such as; mum, dad, brother, sister, grandma/grandpa, aunt and uncle.

We will also learn vocabulary about ourselves such as; face, hair, eyes, body, arms, legs and so on. We will be singing a selection of nursery rhymes to develop language.

Physical Development (PD)

This half term we will be learning how to put on/take off our coats independently. We will also learn how to develop our fine motor skills to grasp and hold a variety of class tools such as pencils.

We will also begin to develop our gross motor skills by running, jumping, pouring and filling containers.

<u>Specific Areas of Learning</u>		
<u>Literacy (L)</u> We will read a selection of stories together about our 'Marvellous Me' topic. Your child will be encouraged to; - Make marks/make a self portrait using pens, pencils, chalk and paints. - They will also be encouraged to try and draw family members.	<u>Maths (M)</u> We follow Mastering the Curriculum (MTC) which supports White Rose Maths (WRM) and maths mastery. The MTC/WRM topics we will cover this term are; - Colours - Matching and Sorting (buttons, shoes and other objects) We will also introduce your child to; - Numberblocks (which support maths learning) - Counting using objects, stories and nursery rhymes - Recognise significant numbers such as their age or door number	<u>Understanding the World (UTW)</u> Your child will be encouraged to; - Talk about their own family and understand that some families are different. <u>Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)</u> Your child will be; - Make marks to draw a picture of themselves - Encouraged to develop their imagination in the role-play home corner by recreating scenarios from home such as 'cooking' for others.
